Adderbury Parish Council Report for February 2020

Meetings - During February 2020, there was one meeting of the Parish Council held on 25 February 2020 and one meeting of the Staffing Committee also held on 25 February 2020. Copies of agendas and minutes are available on the PC web site. <u>www.adderburypc.co.uk</u>

Oxfordshire High Sheriff's Award – The Parish Council was pleased to learn that the Chairman, Diane Bratt, had been given the award for her services to the community over many years. A ceremony would be held on 24 March 2020 at Oxford Town Hall.

Environment/Highways/Footpaths – The Community Speed Watch Scheme was continuing to use the Speed Indication Equipment supplied by Thames Valley Police and also the Sentinel fixed speed camera which had been purchased by the Parish Council. If anyone would like to support the village with this project, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council.

Volunteers were also needed to progress other traffic calming measures, especially in West Adderbury. If any residents wished to assist the Parish Council with the implementation of the speed reductions measures, they should contact the Clerk to the Parish Council. Unfortunately without the support of residents, the Parish Council does not have the capacity to introduce all of the measures it would like. The measures had been approved and costed by the Parish and County Councils and funds are available, we now need the man power to introduce them.

Drainage issues on Oxford Road were continuing to be followed up by a resident and they had been liaising with Oxfordshire County Council about works to correct the issues.

The suggestion of switching off street lights in the village would be discussed at the Annual Parish Meeting on 9 April 2020.

The Parish Council had also been liaising with the Enforcement Department at Cherwell District Council and the Footpaths Officer at Oxfordshire County Council, with regard to the condition of the footpaths and the ditches surrounding the Barwood Homes site on Banbury Road.

A section of the wall between Long Wall footpath and Adderbury Lakes had collapsed recently but had quickly been repaired.

75th Anniversary of VE Day, 8 May 2020 – Residents are encouraged to hold their own events to mark the 75th anniversary of VE Day and there would be an Aunt Agatha's tea party in the village on 10 May 2020.

Adverse Weather - Oxfordshire County Council worked closely with all its partners to monitor the situation with the recent bad weather. As a reminder there are some numbers that you can call to report weather related issues if you become aware of them:

- To report fallen trees or other debris which pose a risk to your safety or the safety of others, please call 999
- To report fallen trees or other debris which doesn't pose such a high risk but still needs to be dealt with, please call 101
- If you lose power or can see that a power line has come down please report it by calling 105
- If you are concerned about flooding, you should visit the Oxfordshire Flood Toolkit online -<u>https://www.oxfordshirefloodtoolkit.com</u> – and I will summarise the key numbers to call below:
- If you have a flooding emergency which is a threat to someone's life, contact Oxfordshire Fire and Rescue Service on 999
- To report flooding relating to a highway such as blocked ditches, blocked drains or flooding on a road call Oxfordshire County Council Floodline on 0345 310 1111
- To report flooding from a main river contact the Environment Agency through the Floodline (Tel: 0345 988 1188 or 0800 80 70 60) or visit their website
- If your property is at immediate risk of surface water flooding please contact Thames Valley Police on 101

Reminder: To dog owners, please ensure that all dog faeces are cleared up and either taken home (and placed in household waste green bins) or placed in the dog waste bins provided. Take extra care on grassed areas where children play.

Dogs must also be kept on a lead in the Lucy Plackett Playing Field and at the Adderbury Lakes Nature Reserve.

When you sign up to Thames Valley Alert (a free service) you will be given login details that will allow you to change your settings at any time. There is also a business watch service and a country watch service.

If you'd like to sign up to Thames Valley Alert, you can join via the Thames Valley Alert website, https://www.thamesvalleyalert.co.uk/ or download the free Thames Valley Alert app by visiting the Apple store or Google Play store. If you already have an Alerts account, you can sign into the app with the same login details.
