| Background   | Melissa Zuydam, a resident of Adderbury, has suggested that the Parish<br>Council obtains the three species on offer from 'The Queen's Green<br>Canopy.' They are Crab Apple, Rowan (Mountain Ash) and Hazel.<br>The following locations have been suggested:<br>Lucy Plackett Playing Field - bottom of field, five trees<br>Oxford Road - outside Red Lion – two trees<br>The Rise - precise location tbc - five trees<br>Croft Lane - next to Squires, two trees<br>Squires Hairdressers - on right, one tree<br>Kemps Road - corner by Silent Soldier – one tree<br>It was also suggested that the triangle outside of the Primary School<br>could be utilised as a wildflower area and the School might be interested<br>in collaborating. |
